“Get Well” Group – Albany, NY

The “Get Well” group of Heroin Anonymous meets Friday night at 7pm in Albany, NY, at 916 Western Ave. The format of the meeting is a 15-minute speaker followed by topic discussion. The first meeting of the “Get Well” group was on Dec. 8th 2014 with 12 people in attendance. The first couple months saw big jumps in attendance week to week, but in the past couple of months the group has grown to 50+ members weekly.

The people in Albany have been very receptive to HA in the area. The group has already been allowed to bring an H&I meeting into an adolescent rehabilitation center. The “Get Well” group

is currently seeking out ways to be of service to local schools who struggle with heroin addiction. The group is also hoping to add another meeting to the area, as soon as they can.

The group was very excited about this spotlight, and is hopeful it will lead to more communication with HA as a whole.
