Personal Story: Lily R. Long Island, NY.

From a very young age, there was not much that I considered exciting. Roller Coasters, Christmas trees, swings, parks - basically the things that are typically appealing in the way of childhood whimsy. However, I was always excited and eager to create. The mode of creating never mattered to me. Whether it was through song, writing, drawing, or even comedy skits that I would perform in my own head, creativity felt like a higher purpose.

Showing others my creations made my heart rush in a way that I couldn't describe at the time. The only thing that compared from that moment was the rush I felt the first time I picked up a drug. I remember suddenly not caring if the thoughts on the inside of my head made it out. I was fine with dozing off and just "being". At first, of course, I imagined it was all some beautiful independent film that had great focused camera views of nodded-out face behind my desk at my 9 to 5.

The suffering was fine because it was, in a way, artistic to me. It felt like a stepping stone, and it

definitely wasn't permanent, maybe it would be over in a couple of months. But the suffering became suffering when actual the consequences became real: when I lost control and the using consumed every thought, activity, desire. All the poetry, drawing, acting - all of it fell to the wayside. People started dying, there were car accidents, the lows reached the pits of hell and back, things got dark fast. Chances are if you, yourself, are afflicted with the disease of addiction, or if you know anyone who is, you know the exact darkness I'm speaking of. It became my life, and I was sure there would be nothing else. This was a means to an end, and I was sure I would be gone before the age of 30 from an overdose or suicide.

I came to the rooms of H.A. many times before I decided to stay. When I finally gave up fighting and admitted my powerlessness, I went to treatment. I got into this program, genuinely and wholeheartedly, and my life changed entirely. My life became an independent film in a whole different way. The focused camera views were moments of overwhelming gratitude because I

felt like I was here for a reason. The inspiration to create came flooding in as soon as my mind was clear, and I began creating again at full speed. But this time I took on way more. I had a huge interest in music and decided to try my hand in that as well.

I would say recovery changed my life but, honestly, without H.A. and the people in it, I don't know that there would be a life to save. The Big Book says it best. "There you will find release from fear, boredom, and worry. Your imagination will be fired. Life will mean something at last." I had the

meaningful things all along: the inspiration, the family, the "book smarts" and all of that. I just didn't care whether I lived or died to use them. Today, every day in which I get to create is a treat and a way to honor the past me who didn't think she was worth it, as well as all the people whom I've unfortunately lost along the way who didn't get a chance.

IT'S ALL ABOUT EFFECTIVENESS

Tradition Twist: Chris C. Birmingham AL.

I really struggled with admitting I was a heroin addict. Mainly because it was a socially unacceptable problem in the upper middle class town from which I came. Alcohol was actually my most recent drug of choice before getting sober. I was able to stop using heroin for about a year, but found myself drinking uncontrollably in the meantime. This landed me in treatment ultimately started my sobriety. I did not have much trouble admitting that I was an alcoholic, given that alcohol was legal and

necessarily seen as a drug in many people's eyes. So my hope was that I

could admit to my alcoholism and brush my darker addictions under the rug. Problem was that I would still find myself obsessing about heroin and couldn't tell anyone.

I ended up going to my first H.A. meeting because it was convenient and I could tell my sober living that I hit a meeting that day. I was blown away by how everyone shared so openly. They showed me how empowering it was to talk about my heroin addiction and that just

admitting my struggles would start to get me past the obsession. There was no shame or judgment. Just

understanding and hope from other men who had been where I was. I followed their path towards getting a sponsor and working the steps, which ultimately provided spiritual awakening which completely removed the problem. Without having a place that upheld Tradition Five, and tried to carry a focused message towards the heroin addict, I would not have had a meeting where I could talk about my secret obsessions and struggles. H.A. gave me a place where I could find a solution to an addiction that could not be openly about in the fellowship's meetings I tried to blend into. I have found that being active in both fellowships has given me the solutions that work for both addictions. I just try to remember to check the outside issues at the door so I don't dilute the message for a newcomer that may not relate to my other addiction.

In my work and personal life, I feel Tradition Five means that I need to play the role that I am assigned and avoid outside distractions. I should strive to focus on my primary purpose of the task at hand, and try to benefit others while doing so. I

can stay focused on my work as opposed to wasting time on social

which media, makes me productive and brings better results for my clients. I can stay focused on being a sponsor, as opposed to being a therapist or friend, which helps us get through the steps. I can focus on being a good friend or family member as opposed to my own selfish ends, which makes for more fulfilling relationships. Staying focused on my primary purpose, whatever it be at the time, removes me from my self-centeredness and improves the quality relationships with God and others. It's all about effectiveness. Once I establish what the focus should be, such as carrying a message on recovery from heroin addiction, I can use this tradition to eliminate distractions and do the best job possible on one thing, as opposed to doing a subpar job on several things.

Teejay S.: Hello, my name is Teejay. I am the Chair of the 2024 World Heroin Anonymous Convention, to be held in Buffalo, New York in 2024. As the chair, my roles are:

 Working closely with the World Services Liaison, who is assigned by the H.A. World Services Board, especially as it pertains to site selection, hotel

- contract negotiations, and contractual obligations.
- Leading the regular
 Steering Committee
 meeting, attended at least
 by the Chairperson, World
 Services Liaison, Advisor,
 Secretary, Vice Chair,
 Program Chair, Treasurer,
 and Hotel Liaisons. The
 Chairperson does not have
 a vote at this meeting,
 except as a tiebreaker.
- Attending each of the main subcommittee meetings to provide guidance (i.e., those of the Vice Chair's, Program Chair's, Treasurer's, and Hotel Liaison's).
- Maintaining regular communication and oversight of each Steering Committee member.
- Working closely with the World Services Liaison and Hotel Liaison to negotiate

and complete the hotel contract.

- Working with the Treasurer and World Services Liaison to oversee the preparation of the convention budget and submission of that budget to H.A. World Services.
- Upholding the 12
 Traditions and 12 Concepts as provided in the H.A.

 World Services Manual.

Lily C.: Tell us about the convention and what progress you guys have made. Is there a specific date for the convention?

Teejay S.: Thus far, we have not secured a hotel contract, but we have been working directly with a hotel and are hopefully walking into a contract signing situation here within the next month. We have been making great progress with all the other subcommittees so far, and we have had a few very successful fundraising events.
