THE BANK OF CAROLYN

Tradition Twist: Carolyn K. West Haven, CT.

"An H.A. group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the H.A. name to any related facility, or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose."

This Tradition speaks to me about building and using the group's treasury, as well as the name of the group itself. Our local membership is very small. It will take us a very long time to see any effects of this Tradition in our area.

We have been around for three and a half years. In that time, we have just been surviving on our original advertising of the new fellowship in Connecticut. We are just now starting a new PI push. We printed flyers and we divided them up amongst the group to deliver them to appropriate locations where we would be able to find "the heroin addict who still suffers."

When I look at this Tradition in my personal life, I see it as, "Carolyn ought never loan money or act the 'big shot' with anyone," lest

resentments of, "When am I getting my money back," and thoughts of,

"I'm better than you," divert me from my primary purpose of helping another person and staying happy, joyous, and free.

I used to feel like the Bank of Carolyn. Many of my friends in recovery would borrow money from me. I had a tracker of who owed me how much money. I really don't like asking people to pay me back what they owe me. It makes me uncomfortable.

Recently, there were three people who owed me various sums of money. I was getting angry and frustrated with them for being very slow to repay — as in not trying or advising me when it would be repaid. The first person continuously borrows money, \$10 here, \$30 there. It would take months to get anything back.

The second person, I loaned money for concert tickets, fully expecting to be paid back in a week. I did get most of this money, but \$40 remained unpaid.

Resentments were growing toward both people. I am resentful toward them for not repaying me, and I am resentful at myself for loaning the money to begin with. My primary purpose in my life is to follow the Steps and Traditions to joyous, and free - and because I feel this way, I can be of service helping another person. My primary purpose was being affected. Whenever these debts crossed my mind, my feelings were hurt. I felt used. I felt taken advantage of. I felt bad. Resentments are here. Now what?

took these financial issues through the steps. I came to the conclusion that my friendships with these folks, as well as my feelings about myself (self-talk), are much more important than the \$70 in question. I talked with my husband, and we concluded to erase the debts. For the first person, I advised her that she doesn't owe me the money anymore. It was about four months without any payment or word. She then stated that she would pay, but I said it wasn't necessary. For the second person, I let him know that

I'm not going to worry about the \$40 anymore.

Now, I'm free from these debts. I don't have to have anger, resentment, or any other bad feeling in my heart about anything.

What did I learn? I would like to say I don't loan money out anymore. That is not the case. The first person needed a financial favor of \$15 from me after I forgave the original amount. Before I agreed to do anything, there was a plan for me to get the money back. Loaned and repaid in the same day.

Getting these issues in order, for me, allowed me to help myself and these two other people. I can now return to being happy, joyous, and free!
